





Finished Is Better Than Perfect

I am cursed with the need to achieve perfection and many years of therapy have lessened the burden but have not yet been able to obliterate it! When I piece, I realize that perfection runs very much ahead of me, only a blip on my horizon. When I quilt, I must remind myself that all pieces are "practice" pieces.

I specifically got rid of my first quilting computerized system and made the conscience decision not to buy another one when I moved from my Husqvarna system to my APQS Millie because I hated the coldness of the computerized designs. Yet, when I quilt, I keep striving for the perfected lines that the computerized system would give me, beating myself up that I just cannot get there.

In one of Angela Walters' YouTube videos I heard her say "Finished is better than perfect!" That, now, has become my new mantra. As I falter when attempting to pick my colors at the beginning of a project all the way through to trying to decide how best to bind or face my quilt, I keep that advice in the forefront of my thoughts to help me move past ruminating on the choices or the stoppage that occurs when I criticize my work. That is the only way I can complete my project.

So, if we share this same trait, even a little, please remember Angela's advice: Finished is better than perfect!
