
Let's all give a big thank you to the Old Craft Store for the donation of their samples late last year. All of those have been made into quilts or table toppers and will be finding new homes.




So, you see, we are all part of a larger community of sewers, supporting our community as a whole. The Quilt Guild is here to help you help others, so just let us know how we can best do that.















August's Virtual Meeting

I never knew my maternal grandmother. I do not have a name I used to call her. To her family she was Sis, on her death certificate she was Beula Vernon Freudiger, nee Rutledge. The only time I saw her was at her funeral when I had just turned six – exactly 60 years ago. But I did know her quilts. We only received two after her passing One was on my parent's bed at least until I was 11 and the other was a trusted companion for every family picnic.


I remember laying on my parent's bed, studying the hand quilting and hand piecing of this double wedding ring quilt. I tried to imagine the woman whose hands hand made it and imagine the clothing the scraps were taken from. At the time I did not look for design elements, use of color, precision of piecing. It was not important to me if her binding was doubled and biased, or if her hand quilting was not precise. What mattered is that through her quilt, I could imagine a loving grandma who was always protecting me.





Now that I look at the picnic quilt, I see the wonkiness of the design and piecing. Until I pulled it out of her cedar chest (now my cedar chest) and put it up on my design wall to takes these pictures I had no idea of the quirky way she pieced the design. Was this her first quilt and the double wedding ring her last? There is no one around anymore who can tell me. The backing of this quilt appears to be from flour sacks that include the name "Wichita Mill & Elevator Company, Wichita Falls, Texas." And though this quilt too is hand pieced and hand quilted, the backing has been put together using a sewing machine.





So, why do I quilt? I quilt to honor the grandmother I never got to meet in person, but felt loved by nonetheless because I could wrap myself into the hugs she left for us to help remember her.
